

THE DEVELOPMENT OF “I” REGRADING PROCESS OF FINE AND APPLIED ARTS FACULTY, SUAN SUNANDHA RAJABHAT UNIVERSITY

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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this article aimed to explore the problems encountered in the process of submitting a solution grade. "I" of the Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University, and guidelines for the development of the process of submitting grade points "I" of the Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University from the Administration, Head of department and Lecturers are total of 48. This research using mixed-method research and presented by descriptive analyses with statistics.

The results of the study showed that the problems encountered in the performance of the grade submission process were solved. "I" Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University The overall level is low, with an average of 2.11. The instructor submits the "I" correction report to the subject for incomplete consideration with an average of 3.75 standard deviation of 1.32, and the instructor does not complete the evidence and documents for correcting the "I" grade with an average of 3.55 standard deviation of 1.45. Development Guidelines consist of 1) the university announces the academic calendar in the REG.SSRU.AC.TH system and notifies the instructors, 2) Lecturers submits the "I" correction grade in the REG.SSRU.AC.TH system 3) prints the "I" revision report sheet with his signature. "I" PDF format into Google Drive 4) Faculty download data from Google Drive to check the courses 5) Faculty summarizes the imported data at the meeting of the Faculty Academic Committee 6) The faculty confirms the courses that have been approved to revise the grade level. "I" enters the registration system in the SSS.SSRU.AC.TH system and makes a memorandum of submission to the Division of Educational Services.

INTRODUCTION

According to Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University regulations on Undergraduate Education B.E. 2561. The university is required to provide bachelor's degree education in 3 forms: formal education, non-formal education management, and free education management.

Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, it offers full-time undergraduate students, which is a full-time study. In 1 academic year, divided into 2 semesters of study duration of not less than 15 weeks, and may be offered in the summer semester with the number of credits to be comparable to the regular semester.

Academic Assessment and Evaluation (1) The University provides for the assessment of the academic performance of the courses or sets of subjects in which students enroll in at least once per semester. Upon the last assessment of any course or set of subjects, the course shall be deemed to have ended. (2) Students must participate in teaching activities not less than 80% of the time according to the prescribed instructional plan of the course or subject name

to be eligible for measurement and evaluation in that subject or set of subjects. (3) The University uses a grade level system and grade values to measure and evaluate results by dividing the grades into 12 levels of academic transcripts, namely A- A- B+ B B- C+ C C- D+ D D- F. (4) Courses or sets of subjects designated to be measured and evaluated with the letters "S" or "U". (5) The display of academic results in subjects or sets of subjects that are not evaluated or not evaluated shall be displayed by the letter "I" mean incomplete (Incomplete) and the letter "I" as a symbol that the assessment of the course or set of subjects is not complete. The provision of the letter "I" in a course or set of subjects is permitted in the event that (A) a student is unable to take the assessment in that course or set of subjects by force majeure with evidence of (B) the instructor and/or head of the subject that teaches in any course or set of subjects deems it appropriate to wait for the results of the study as part of the evaluation in that course or set of subjects. Students are required to take corrective action. "I" is a grade or letter "S" or "U" at least two weeks before the final exam of the next regular semester. If such deadline expires, the university will change the letter "I" to a grade "F" or letter "U" value.

In the assessment and evaluation of the Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts. Require instructors to submit their grades. The process is in accordance with the announcement of Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University. Dated February 16, 2021 Re: Guidelines for sending grades consisted of guidelines for submitting grades, which in order to submit academic results must be processed in time for the announcement of academic activities of the university. "I" through the online system in a new system that has been developed to replace the old system. The point rating value was delivered in the system in error. Delayed delivery is not in accordance with the deadline for the announcement of the academic calendar of events, causing an impact on students, such as students' grades being adjusted to F, resulting in the cumulative grade point average not meeting the specified criteria. Announcement of termination of students status Expenses for maintaining the condition be a student waiting to graduate in that semester and failing to graduate on time, as well as storing large amounts of documents, wastes resources.

From such a problematic condition, we recognize the importance of improving the process of delivering grade points. "I" of the Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts to solve various problems in accordance with the announcement of the academic calendar and regulations of Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University. In this article, the presentation of content is divided into 2 parts: problem conditions and guidelines for the development of the process of submitting solutions to the grade level. "I" of Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University.

RESULT

The problems encountered in the submission process, the grade level is solved. "I" Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University has an impact on students, resulting in some cases where students do not graduate on time. The researcher then analyzed it to design a more efficient operational process. This is in line with the concept of Longthong (2019) who said that work process improvement should start from improving the work that is being done. How to achieve the goals set by responsible workers and how to achieve maximum efficiency.
