



Figure 1: Research process for finding of Online Learning Management in COVID-19 Epidemic for the Bachelor of Fine and Applied Arts Program in Performing Arts (Thai Dance and Theatre), Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts, Suan Sunandha Rajabhat University Source: Ratiphat Siripong








Figure 2: Presentation's independent study and senior project topic. Source: Ratiphat Siripong




Figure 6: Preparing show for publication. Source: Ratiphat Siripong
