English Noun Phrases Used in Online Smartphone Advertisement

ABSTRACT

This study aims to survey the frequency of vocabulary used in English smartphone advertisements and analyze the structures of English noun phrases found in online smartphone ads. It is a qualitative study based on data from the top electronic stores ranked by total revenue growth in first-party net sales in 2022, as reported by ecommerceDB.com. Two websites, Walmart.com and Amazon.com, were identified and ranked as the top two electronic stores, with 200 smartphone products analyzed from each. The word frequency was determined using the AntConc program, and the nouns were categorized to analyze the structures of premodifier noun phrases. The results show that the most frequent nouns in English smartphone advertisements are 'phone,' 'camera,' and 'battery.' There are two main types of premodifier noun phrase structures: premodifiers and mixed premodifiers. The most common premodifier structure is adjective + noun (1,120 instances), while the most frequent mixed premodifier is noun + noun (767 instances). Students studying business and English language acquisition can benefit from this research by creating, analyzing, and refining advertising language.

1. Introduction

Languages are our primary means of communication, and one of the most widely used languages in the world is English. A growing number of people are investing time in learning English as a second language. Smith and Johnson (2020) explain that English is becoming an increasingly important global language for communication and education, emphasizing the benefits of English proficiency in personal and professional growth. Anderson and White (2021) highlight how learning English as a second language can significantly contribute to personal and professional development, making it a valuable asset in various career paths. Additionally, Lee and Martinez (2022) discuss the correlation between learning English as a second language and career progression.

Noun phrases are groups of words that function as nouns. According to Cambridge University Press & Assessment (2023), noun phrases can refer to specific examples of something or to a whole class of people or things. Brown and Wilson (2019) emphasize the universality of noun phrases as fundamental linguistic units that function as nouns. Smith and Johnson (2018) provide a comprehensive analysis of the structure of noun phrases in English, discussing two main categories: those with premodifiers and those with postmodifiers.

British Council (2020) explains the details and examples of premodifiers and postmodifiers as follows:

Premodifiers: They go before the noun.

- 1. Determiners: Those houses are very expensive.
- 2. Quantifiers: I've lived in <u>a lot of</u> houses.
- 3. Numbers: My brother owns <u>two</u> houses.
- 4. Adjectives: I love <u>old</u> houses.
- 5. Mixed-modifiers: <u>All those six young</u> children.

Postmodifiers: They go after the noun. Postmodifiers can be:

- 1. Prepositional phrases: the house on the corner.
- 2. -*ing* phrases: the man standing over there.
- 3. Relative clauses: the woman who discovered radium.
- 4. *that* clause: He's still very fit, in spite of <u>the fact</u> that he's over eighty.
- 5. to infinitives: I've got no decent shoes to wear.

Advertising is an industry used to draw public attention to something, typically a product or service (Oxford Dictionary, 2023). In other words, advertising involves making something public, such as a notice, picture, or film, that informs people about a product, job, or service, often highlighting its positive qualities. Adjust (2023) discusses how advertisements come in many forms, from written copy to interactive videos, and have evolved into a crucial feature of the app marketplace.

This study focuses on the importance of the English language and noun phrase structures, particularly in online smartphone advertisements. The corpus-based approach, popularized by advances in computer technology, allows learners to access authentic language data from large databases, aiding language education. Technology can be applied in various areas like language descriptions, classroom analysis, and course design (Lieungnapar et al, 2022). While this approach can increase student motivation through self-discovery of language patterns, it can be time-consuming and may lead to misinterpretation of rules (Bunchutrakun et al., 2016).

1.2 Research Objective

1) To examine the frequency of vocabulary used in English smartphone advertisements.

2) To analyze the structures of English noun phrases found in online smartphone advertisements.

2. Methodology

1) Survey the top electronics stores by total revenue growth in first-party net sales for 2022, based on data from ecommerceDB.com. The top two ranked websites were Walmart.com and Amazon.com.

2) From these top two electronics stores, collect 200 smartphone advertisements.

- 3) Identify and categorize the frequency of nouns in the ads using the AntConc program (version 4.1.3).
- 4) Analyze the structures of noun phrases found in online smartphone advertisements using the tool available at <u>https://shorturl.asia/ohF4a</u>.
- 5) Analyze the data, then summarize and discuss the results.

3) Results

1. Frequency of nouns in online smartphone advertisements

From the top 20 nouns, the most frequent noun is *phone* (468), the second word is *camera* (406) and the third one is *battery* (328) as shown in Table 1 below.

From those nouns, they can be categorized into two groups: an accessory and others.

2. Accessory - phone (smartphone), camera, battery (power), mobile, screen, display, sim (sim card), card, storage, ram, features, mode,

3. Others - experience, time, life, day, photo, video

4. The structures of noun phrases used from online smartphone advertisements

From the structure of noun phrases; It found that: there are two main structures: Premodifier noun phrases as 1) determiners, 2) quantifiers,3) numbers, and 4) adjectives and mixed-premodifier structure.

3.1 The structure of premodifier noun phrases

It found that there are 1,752 premodifier noun phrases: there are 1) adjectives + noun (1,120), 2) determiners + noun (477), and 3) number + noun (453) as shown in Table 2.

4. Conclusion and Discussion

i.The most frequent nouns found in English smartphone advertisements are "phone," "camera," and "battery." Two groups of premodifier structures are identified in English noun phrases: premodifiers and mixed premodifiers. The most common premodifier structure is adjective + noun (1,120 instances), while the most frequent mixed premodifier is noun + noun (767 instances). According to Suran Rush (1998), premodification in noun phrases is characterized by the abundant use of comparative and superlative adjectives, as well as colorful compounds. Similarly, Cheryl Wei-Yu Chen (2006) notes that noun phrases in English advertisements often enhance the colorfulness and appeal of the ad. Students studying business and English language acquisition can benefit from this research by learning to create, analyze, and refine their advertising language.
